

CALL FOR CLIMATE JUSTICE 8 & 9 OCTOBER

Micah (6:8) tells us to “act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God.” Will you walk humbly with us, asking for mercy for the vulnerable and oppressed and seeking justice in Jesus name?

This November, world leaders are meeting in Glasgow for important climate negotiations (COP26).

We are called to care for creation (Gen 2:15) , to be good stewards of the land and to protect all of God’s creatures, and to love our neighbour as ourselves – that means our global neighbours too. It is imperative that these global leaders make decisions which protect people not bank balances, to decide that no country will go into debt tackling climate change. It’s a decade-defining opportunity to make a stand.

On Saturday 9 October there is a call to action as we all make our way to the Anglican cathedral to have our prayers blessed and then sent to Glasgow where they will form part of a National display.

- Meet at Quaker Meeting House on School Lane (5 mins walk from Central station) at 2pm and walk the last leg to the cathedral
- Join us at the Cathedral at 2:30pm and be part of a memorable service where the eight planned walks will join together for Evensong and we will all present our prayers to be blessed.
